PROTOCOL

of the Third Meeting of the Joint Board for Scientific and Technological Cooperation between the Republic of Slovenia and the Republic of Albania

(Working Programme for the years 2010- 2011)

According to the Article 9 of the Agreement on Scientific and Technological Cooperation between the Republic of Slovenia and the Republic of Albania, signed on 23 February 2005, the Third Meeting of the Slovenian-Albanian Joint Board for Scientific and Technological cooperation was held in Ljubljana on 31 March 2010 in order to implement the above mentioned agreement.

The Slovenian delegation was headed by Ms. Tea Glažar, M.Sc., Head of Office for International Cooperation, Ministry of Higher Education, Science and Technology of the Republic of Slovenia.

The Albanian delegation was headed by Mr. Skender Uku, General Secretary, Ministry of Education and Science of the Republic of Albania.

The list of the two delegations is given in Annex 1.

The Joint Board adopted the following agenda:

- 1. Exchange of information on current issues in Science and Technology
- 2. Selection and approval of the project proposals
- 3. Financial support for the approved projects
- 4. Preparation of the next Working Programme
- 5. Closing provisions

Ad 1. Exchange of information on current issues in Science and Technology

The two delegations exchanged information on the latest developments in the R&D sector in their respective countries. The experience stemming from bilateral and multilateral cooperation (including participation in international R&D programmes) of the two countries was exchanged. Both delegations expressed their confidence that the implementation of the Working Programme for the years 2010-2011 will contribute significantly to the development of beneficial links between S&T institutions, universities and scientists of both countries. The delegations agreed to encourage their researchers to jointly participate in EU Programmes.

Ad 2. Selection and approval of the project proposals

The Joint Board established that twelve (12) proposals had been submitted on time on the Slovenian side and twelve (12) project proposals on the Albanian side. The project proposals were peer-reviewed by both Parties according to the procedures approved at the first meeting. The Slovenian-Albanian Joint Board for Scientific and Technological Cooperation

approved funding of ten (10) projects for cooperation for the period 2010 - 2011. The list of approved projects is enclosed as Annex 2.

At the end of the project the final report on the results achieved, signed by both of the project leaders, shall be submitted to the responsible institutions.

Ad 3. Financial support for the approved projects

- a) The following rules and regulations apply with regard to the expenses:
- the sending Party covers the travel expenses between the research institutions;
- the receiving Party covers the accommodation, subsistence and local travel expenses as follows:

In Slovenia:

The Slovenian side covers the costs of the Albanian researcher in the amount of 21,39€ per diem as a daily allowance and separately the cost of accommodation, according to the legislation in force.

The Slovenian side will finance mobility costs for each project up to 4000€ for the whole duration of the project. Research costs are co-financed by national research institutions.

In Albania:

In case of short term visits (maximum 14 days) 9000 Lek/day (app. 72€), in case of long term visits (1-3 months) 120.000 Lek/month (app. 960€) for accommodation and daily allowance.

Based on the Call for proposals, the Albanian side will finance mobility and research costs for each project up to 1.500.000 Lek (app. 12.000€) for the whole duration of the project.

b) The amount of daily allowance may be adjusted by the receiving Party according to the national regulations in force.

Ad 4. Preparation of the next Working Programme

a) The Joint Board agreed that the Slovenian and the Albanian Parties shall launch the next call for proposals for the period 2012 -2013 by the beginning of March 2011, with the deadline for submission of project proposals by June, 2011.

The applications have to be sent by the Slovenian project leaders to the Slovenian Research Agency, and by the Albanian project leaders to the Ministry of Education and Science and to the Agency for Research, Technology and Innovation of the Republic of Albania, respectively.

b) The parties agreed to encourage the cooperation of young scientists especially at the postdoctoral level.

- c) In the next call priority will be given to new partnerships.
- d) Before next call parties will consider possibilities for additional forms of cooperation.
